<p>Discussion: Monash Kpop Club (MKC) executives presented the goals and purpose of MKC. Activities would be craft focused. First event would be a launch party to welcome members, with a 'deco with dalgona' event also planned, for which they have outlined their budget for supplies. Shreedevi enquired about member retention strategies, which they described as their frequent events that aren't too complex to run – their focus on different kpop groups will also draw in different people at different times. Mehika asked whether there could be conflict within the club between different kpop group fans. This has been considered by executives, who whilst promoting inclusivity have also planned to have a strict policy on these kinds of disagreements, including a strike system. No other concerns were raised.</p>

<p>Discussion: Rebecca Murphy speaks on the MONSU Caulfield General Manager Q1 Report and notes the highlights. The majority of expenses in Q1 were due to events, also reflected in expenses through workshop and marketing. Good position for the rest of the year. Artificial Intelligence (AI) is a key issue identified by Student Rights & Support, with many students being picked up for misconduct and academic integrity. Many students are unaware they're being recorded from above during exams at Clayton and this is being used as evidence in misconduct cases. Connected Apple devices are also causing issues. We're looking into putting out more advice to students about this and to get the university to alert students about these issues. The university is looking at changing policies and procedures around APC hearings by the end of semester 2.</p>
