1. Support Program Upskill Idea Discussion: This item is presented by Xie Antonio. “MONSU + UP!” is a program that would be by students, for students. It aims to support personal development. Students can apply to run their own workshop, receive training on how to facilitate their workshop (and receive a Certificate of Completion), and be provided with supplies to help them run this. This can enhance students’ CVs and skillsets when job searching. Roughly \$200 allocated per session, but this would depend on the number of sign-ups/student interest. Han suggested engaging with a third-party facilitator initially to help raise awareness of the program. Xie will be overseeing these workshops with the help of MONSU volunteers for set-up.

2. MONSU Caulfield Privacy Policy Suite Discussion: This item is presented by Rebecca Murphy and Clare Hughes, who wrote the policies. MONSU’s current privacy policy was passed in 2016 and is now 10 years old and requires revision. Policies also needed to be updated to support the launch of the new MONSU website. The policy is informed by state and national guidelines as to how data and personal information must be handled. Personal information that is collected by MONSU Caulfield Inc. in the course of its operations may include names, contact information, and student and academic information. There are three distinct policies: the main policy, website privacy statement, and public facing policy. The Website Privacy Statement also provides eSafety Guides for different social media platforms. No questions raised.

Notes:	WELCOME HERE is a multi-campus project with REDI (Respect, Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion). It is focused on creating visual queer representation on buildings around Caulfield campus. Visual representation is currently limited. This project proposes that stickers be put up in the Monash Sport Centre, Caulfield Library, University Health Services, Monash Connect, MONSU Workshop and MONSU offices that present the colours of the LGBTQIA+ flag and ideally a QR code linking to MONSU.QUEER resources.
MSO Student Representative Meet-Ups	
Notes:	At the beginning of semester 2, MONSU Caulfield will be hosting a networking event involving representatives from all Monash University MSOs. This event will be an opportunity to learn more about how each MSO operates and build connections with our equivalents in other organisations. In coming years this event would be held earlier in the year, during semester one. Shreedevi enquired about whether we can pitch the creation of a new role within a particular organisation. Rebecca explained it is important that not all MSOs look the same and have the same roles, and something like this would also require a constitutional change. David asked why having the same structure across MSOs would be a bad thing. Rebecca explained this has caused political issues in the past. Council members expressed positive interest in this event and MSO collaboration.
